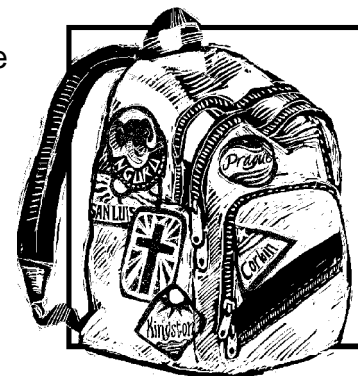

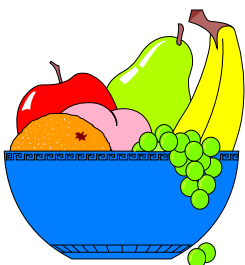

Introducing Rod Huther

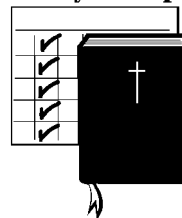

Bible Study - Peacemaking

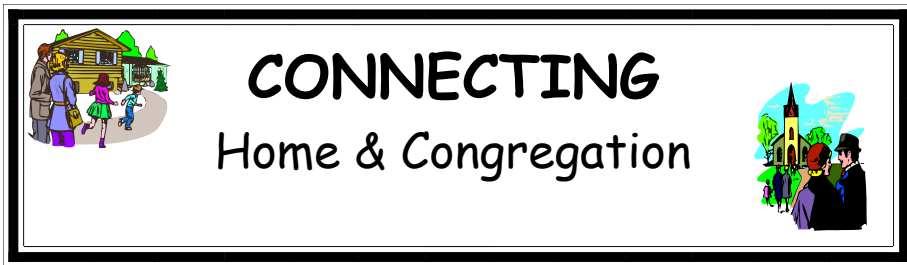
What do you think of when you hear the word peace? Quiet streams? Calmness? Tranquility or the absence of war?

If we were to discuss peacemaking without Scripture as a guide, we might discuss stress management, muscle relaxation, retirement planning or how to make friends.

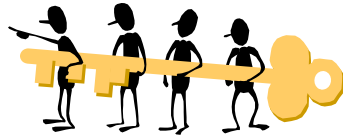
Biblically, however, peacemaking begins with and is an integral part of the vision of shalom—God's plan for us and the world.

Biblically, peace comes through the cost and risk of deep caring. Compassionate peace inevitably results in working for justice and reconciliation rather than stress reduction. It comes through the cross and the scandal of crucified love rather than through planned defense against those we fear or those with whom we differ.

Family Devotions

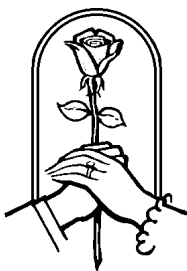
In the morning, before school, preview the days activities and the people who will be involved. Then, pray for teachers, students and friends by name.

Globe Offering

September-January—20% of all money placed in the globe will be going to provide bed nets for Malawi. The bed nets help prevent the children and pregnant women from getting malaria.

We will be donating the globe offering in the memory of Coness. Coness was the little girl Bishop Berg used as the poster child for his traveling throughout the Synod. Coness died recently from malaria.



Dear friends,

The small but regular income over 40 women earn by making beadwork has transformed their lives. Bethany works closely with two groups but cannot take on any additional women requesting to join. A new women's group of 28 called Nanyor was turned down. Discussions followed about possible alternative projects including camels. Camels do well in our arid environment and browse on thorn scrub that goats and cattle cannot. They are disease resistant. They produce milk throughout the 5-month dry season when cattle do not. When we approached Heifer Project International about acquiring camels and training for the group they were extremely helpful. They promised Nanyor one bull and 8 females if we could raise the money for six additional females ourselves. Nanyor will raise money for two and we are asking supporting congregations to give toward the other 4 camels (\$600 per camel). Nanyor, Heifer Project, and we are excited about making this happen.

Our boys Nyika and Zaka will begin 6th grade at Rift Valley Academy in Kenya this September. It is situated at 7,000 ft in lush forest overlooking extinct volcanoes on the Rift Valley floor. After five years of home schooling in the bush, they are ready for new opportunities. They will be in a dorm with 10 other boys. Nyika and Zaka's three-day visit to the school in May left them eager to start. Steve spent three years at RVA in the 1970s and loved it. Shalai, age 5, wants you to know her goat gave birth to twins last month.

Last week Maasai morani warriors ran 2 hours to call for help. Two of their friends had been fighting with sharp double-edged simes and one was cut badly on the upper arm, the other sustained a deep abdominal wound. We drove up Ketumbeine mountain for an hour. By the side of the trail we washed loops of intestine with 5 gallons of water, rinsed with saline, reinserted bowel, packed the wound with gauze, and gave IV fluids and antibiotics. After a 4-hour rough ride he got surgery and by God's help recovered without any complications.

Thank you for remembering our family and community. We are privileged to see the Good News of Jesus touching people spiritually and physically.

For Those Who Want to Learn More

The Lay School of Theology at Luther Seminary is a program of informal, non-credit classes taught by seminary professors for lay persons who want to learn more about matters that relate to their Christian faith and life. Starting this fall, one lay school class per session will be available online allowing individuals and congregations to grow deeper in their faith without having to go to the Seminary.

The class to be offered will take place on Monday evenings 7-9 pm, Sept. 17- Oct. 15 in the gathering area at Zion. The class is titled "The Gospel of John." For those who are not able to make the class time, courses will be archived for one week. Computers at church are available for your use. Call the church office if you are interested.

The Gospel of John invites the reader into a relationship with the Word of God incarnate in Jesus Christ. In compelling ways the actions, teachings and signs of Jesus draw the reader into the conflict that Jesus and the early Christian church faced in making known and proclaiming God's living presence in the Roman world. Jesus' final words from the cross, "It is finished," proclaim the completion of Jesus' earthly ministry and Jesus' resurrection words, "Receive the Holy Spirit," empower and lead us into our life and witness to Jesus Christ in the 21st century world.

Other classes will be offered in winter and spring: "Holy Spirit, the Church and the Triune God." (Jan. 28-Feb. 25), "God's Name is Surprise: Stories of Faith in Luke and Acts." and (March 31-April 28).
